ORDINANCE 0-14-11

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5, LICENSING AND REGULATION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AMENDING THE DEFINITION OF RESTAURANT AND LOWER THE BUILDING VALUATION IN THE INTOXICATING LIQUOR LICENSE STANDARDS OF THE DELANO CITY CODE

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DELANO ORDAINS:


Section 1. Chapter 5, Licensing and Regulation of Alcoholic Beverages, Section 502.01, Subd. 21 (Restaurants) is hereby amended to read as follows:

Subd. 21. "Restaurant" is an establishment, other than a hotel, under the control of a single proprietor or manager, where meals are regularly prepared on the premises and served at tables to the general public, and having a seating capacity as the City Council determines is adequate based on the following standards:

- A. The restaurants must have a full commercial State licensed kitchen and meals are prepared on site.
- B. The restaurant must have a full service dinner menu with meals served at tables.
- C. The restaurants shall have minimum interior seating capacity of not less than fifty (50) people.
- D. The building shall be compliant with all Building and Fire Codes and meet all health standards of the Minnesota Food Code.
- E. If the establishment contains facilities for sporting, entertainment, recreation or cultural activities, the seating capacity may be for a minimum of 30 guests without meeting Provisions A-D above.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage and publication according to law.
