Personal Statement:

Brief Artist Statement: It was always my dream to be a public sculptor, and after 10 years of loving teaching art I decided to take a "short break" to focus on my own artistic vision. My first public commission was an extremely challenging 45' tall sculpture that turned out great, but had an extremely steep learning curve. It was a real challenge, but I loved it! After this, I have been living out my dream, making the rounds on rotating public sculpture tours and chasing large public commissions ever since.

I especially enjoy making sculptures that encourage the viewer to move around the space, rewarding them with unique views from each perspective and facilitating exploration of the entire space. I like to use strong contrast in my pieces to draw the viewer in from a distance, often juxtaposing dark steel and bright aluminum. I then use rich surface textures to keep the viewers attention and reward them for taking a closer look.
